One of the things that I have so enjoyed since I moved back home to Scotland is becoming more acquainted with our beautiful countryside. Growing up in Argyllshire I was used to seeing beauty but, I don't think I appreciated it like I do now. I enjoy walking, even if it's just around Coupar Angus. However, the walks I enjoy more than any are when Sandra (Jack) and I go out walking. We walk locally and have ventured much further out. We have known exactly where we're going, and we have, once or twice, resorted to reading the map in order to get home. We talk, laugh, share our ups and downs, and Sandra has (patiently?) answered most of my many questions.

One of the things that I miss about living in Texas is Country and Western music. Now, I like it - but in small doses. So, once every 6 months or so I will listen to it for a wee while when I'm busy in the kitchen. A few months ago I heard a gospel country song being sung, "Just a little talk with Jesus." I admit when I first heard that song many years ago I heard the words incorrectly and would sometimes sing to myself "Have a little walk with Jesus."

That day when I heard the song I laughed to myself at my own past mistakes, but then I started thinking - thinking about my own walk, and talks, with Jesus, and thinking about my walks with Sandra. And I realised that the enjoyment I get from those walks is the enjoyment I should be getting from my daily walks with God. But, do I always remember to "enjoy" my walk with God, and to tell Him as I'm walking with Him?

Church of Scotland Stamp Appeal

I have recently posted off another batch of used stamps. Before sending them off I spent some time trimming them up and separating them into the different types of stamps. In this batch of over 3500 stamps there were over 1000 1st Class, 1700 2nd Class, 220 Priced and 560 from Overseas. At present the majority of the stamps being donated are still older stamps - pre barcode, but the barcoded ones are becoming more prevalent now. Strangely though, only 26 of the 600 newer stamps have King Charles on them.

The stamps from overseas are always interesting, coming from 29 different countries across the world.
