From the Interim Moderator

It is my pleasure to be asked to contribute to this edition of ISLA Link. At the start of February I took over from Donna Hays as your Interim Moderator. I was privileged to be at the last service she took when she was thanked for her work in guiding you over the last wee while and I was able to introduce myself very briefly to you. Now I have a chance to tell you a little more.



I am a retired minister living in Letham. My ministry, working backwards consisted of eight and a half years in a charge in Muthill linked with Trinity Gask. Before that I was fourteen years in Wishaw, Lanarkshire. And my first charge was a linkage again, Kinlochleven linked with Nether Lochaber near Fort William and I was there for fifteen years.

I understand the concern and anxiety you have about the future of Coupar Angus Abbey and Bendochy. We are living in a time of great change in the Church of Scotland. The reason for the crisis we are in is plain. Numbers of church members have been declining since the early 1960s. In the last few years the financial pressures that has caused have been extreme and something had to be done. Whether we are doing the right thing or not time will tell.

If I say I understand what you are going through, it is because in my last charge, Trinity Gask, the smaller of the two churches in the linkage was dissolved. The current building was a plain but beautiful building from the 18th century, probably built on the site of a previous church which would have been much earlier but there are no records. At the bottom of the hill is a well which was known to the Romans and in living memory water from it was used for baptisms, so I imagine this was a special spiritual place and focus for worship going back a very long way.

In my second charge the church I was inducted to was united with a neighbouring congregation and when arbiters decided the other church should be the place of worship my first church was closed and sold and we all moved to the other building.

My first charge was the highland linkage. I lived in Kinlochleven and about 11 miles down the road was Nether Lochaber church. These churches are still open, but the manse is now in Duror and all four charges around Loch Leven are one church with four places of worship but probably reducing to three soon.

My job as Interim Moderator is to be alongside you and help you navigate through the next period in your life. There have been and will be big changes. My role is to represent you to the Presbytery and represent the Presbytery to you. The Presbytery will make whatever decisions it sees fit and I will communicate them to you. I will help you decide whatever you feel is right and be your voice on Presbytery. In the meantime, in the short time I have had to get to know some of you and how things are going in CAA and Bendochy I have been greatly encouraged by your hard work and gifts, and your ability to do so much even in vacancy. It has been said so often, and perhaps in these days it is more important than ever to reflect on the truth of these words, that the church is not the building. The church is the people. You have many able and committed people with a vision for the future and faith that God is with you sustaining your hope and confidence. Hold on to him as he holds on to you and be the church in your parishes.

"Nearer my God to Thee"

How many of us think of the film Titanic (released in 1997) without thinking of the hymn "Nearer my God to Thee"? Thanks to Hollywood, that hymn is iconically linked with the film. Was it played as the Titanic sunk, or was that pure Hollywood? It was reported by some survivors that it was played as the ship was sinking. We may never know for certain but, where did the hymn come from?

It was written by Sarah Flower Adams who lived in England from 1805-1848. Her mother died when Sarah was five and she, and her sister, were raised by their father. Sarah was raised in a strict environment but was around many liberal-thinking people, Robert Browning, Harriet Martineau amongst others. These acquaintances attributed to Sarah questioning her Christian beliefs. The family was friends with a Unitarian minister, William Fox, who helped Sarah, and her sister, through this time when faith was being questioned.

It was after going through this time in her life that Sarah wrote this hymn:

"Nearer my God to Thee, nearer to Thee E'en though it be a cross that raiseth me."

William Fox had asked Sarah to write a hymn based on the story of Jacob's dream at Bethel in Genesis 28. He needed a hymn to end his service so Sarah composed the now well-known hymn.

This hymn, although not always widely accepted, now brings hope and peace to millions of people worldwide. It was said to be a favourite of Queen Victoria and US President William McKinlay.

Scottish connection? Sarah holidayed in Scotland with her family and in 1823 broke the record for the fastest ascent of a woman up Ben Lomond!

Updating The Abbey Church Cook Book



Work continues to bring together an updated version of the Abbey Church Cook Book, but it is not quite ready yet.

There is still time to submit recipes for inclusion and I am happy to receive them in whatever format you can provide. The recipe below is one of our new additions.

Hot Cross Muffins

(adapted from "Muffins, Fast and Fantastic", 3rd Edition, by Susan Reimer) This is a lovely way of using up any jars of mincemeat

left after your Christmas baking. Traditionally, rich fruits, eggs and other sweet things were given up during the period of Lent and so Easter celebrated the return of these delights to our tables through baked treats on Easter Sunday.

Makes 11-12 standard sized muffins

Ingredients:

10oz (280g) self-raising flour

1/2 teaspoon (2.5 ml) bicarbonate of soda

1/2 teaspoon (2.5 ml) salt

1 egg

8 fl oz (240 ml) milk

3 fl oz (90 ml) sunflower oil

3oz (85g) fine white granulated sugar

3 oz (85g) sultanas

8fl oz (240 ml) ready-made mincemeat (about 12 oz/350g)

Thin, narrow slices of marzipan to make crosses for the tops

Method:

- Prepare muffin tins (deep pan tins with deep papers to allow muffins to rise correctly). Preheat oven to 375-400°F (190-200 °C) for a conventional oven, Gas Mark 5-6.
- 2. In a large bowl, sift together: flour, bicarbonate of soda, salt and sugar.
- 3. In a separate bowl, beat egg with a fork, stir in milk; mincemeat and oil.
- 4. Pour all of liquid ingredients into dry mixture. Stir just until combined, adding the sultanas during the final strokes. The batter will be lumpy, but no dry flour should be visible. Do not over-stir.
- 5. Fill muffin cups three-quarters full. Place marzipan strips across tops of muffins and bake for 20-25 minutes until tops are lightly browned and spring back when pressed gently. Allow muffins to cool for several minutes to make removal easier.


In our most recent batch of stamps there were 111 1st Class, 618 2nd Class, 23 Priced and 52 from 11 different countries. (339 pre barcode)
